(BCP, 457)

We are hoping to phase in in-person worship beginning on Sunday, June 14. A statement of procedures and safety measures for us to follow will be sent out in the next day or so. We are determined to follow the best recommendations of medical

professionals and state and local officials. The standards include wearing some kind of face covering, keeping a minimum of 6 feet away from other people, and not having congregational singing. I regret that, out of pastoral concern for the welfare and safety of our more vulnerable and our elderly members, I cannot recommend everyone in our congregation to come to church right now. When we do announce the beginning of in-person worship, you will be asked to write and email to Susan Austin or call her and reserve a place for yourself in advance. She will need all reservation requests by Thursday at noon of the week before we begin in-person worship. You are encouraged to look for updates on our Facebook page and by email.
