Attendees may volunteer to read a lesson, so have your favorite Bible handy also. There will be an opportunity to add your own intercessions, either silently or aloud. Rite II Evening Prayer begins on p. 117 of the Prayer Book. The service takes about twenty to twenty-five minutes.
