If you will not be receiving the chalice, please cross your arms and bow your head when the priest or chalice bearer comes by.)

If you would like a blessing instead of receiving communion, bow your head and cross your arms over your chest, and the priest will give you a blessing.

If you would like to receive communion in one kind at your seat in the pew, stay there and the priest will bring a host to you after giving communion to the people at the altar rail.)

If a person desires to receive the Sacrament, but, by reason of extreme sickness of physical disability, is unable to eat and drink the Bread and Wine, the Celebrant is to assure that person that all the benefits of Communion are received, even though the Sacrament is not received with the mouth. Wednesday Noon Eucharist

This Wednesday, August 18, we will celebrate the Eucharist at noon. We will observe the ordinations of the American Samuel Johnson and other prominent Congregationalist ministers who “read themselves into” the Church of England. They were moved by study of scripture, history, and the Book of Common Prayer to doubt the validity of their Congregationalist ordination and to seek orders within the Apostolic Succession through the Church of England, which they received, whereupon they became prominent clergy in the Colonial Church.
