Vicar's Vagaries:

Holy Week and Easter in the Pandemic, II

This is the second year we will be having Holy Week and Easter services during the pandemic. Last

year, we weren't gathering in person, but we had music. Now, we are allowing up to around 24 people into the church, but we are not singing. As more people receive their vaccinations, it could be that more will begin coming soon. Flo Kline is back, having had both of her shots, and we are extremely glad to see her! As before, our services will be broadcast on Facebook Live from our Facebook group page; and they will be posted on YouTube.

For **Palm Sunday**, we will have one service at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 28. We will begin with the palm liturgy, have a dramatic reading of the Passion According to Mark, and celebrate the Eucharist in this first service of Holy Week. Then on **Maundy Thursday**, April 1, we will meet at 6:00 p.m. at the church to celebrate the Eucharist. The stripping of the altar will conclude the service. At this service, we will all remember that night when Christ celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples and told them to "Do this to recall my presence among you." See First Corinthians 11:23-26, which is perhaps the oldest extant version of the words of Jesus himself at that last gathering on the night before he was crucified.

On **Good Friday** at 3:00, April 2, we will gather for the solemn liturgy of Good Friday, with the liturgy of the word, the dramatic reading of the Passion According to John, a sermon, the Solemn Collects of Good Friday, and the Veneration of the Cross. There is no celebration of the Eucharist on Good Friday.

On **Easter Day**, April 4, we will gather to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord at 10:00 a.m. By that time, there may be many signs around us of the beginning of recovery from the coronavirus, and the natural world should be in full bloom. While good feelings of new freedom and new life may be all around us, there is no new beginning that compares to the victory of Jesus Christ over the grave when he was raised from the dead.

We will continue to celebrate the Easter Season through **Pentecost**, which will be Sunday, May 23 this year. **Ascension Day** will be Thursday, May 13.

Lenten Hymn Includes the Glory of Easter

“Lord, who throughout these forty days”

The Hymnal 1982, #142

Most of you know that I was born and raised a Baptist, so the Liturgical Year was not something I grew up on. Yes, we had services on Good Friday, but the season of Lent was not something we observed.

As I have learned about Lent, I have come to love the time of introspection and penance. One of the most meaningful hymns of Lent is “Lord, who throughout these forty days” by Claudia Frances Hernaman. She was born and raised in Surrey, England, the daughter of an Anglican priest. She married a minister and devoted her life to the spiritual education of children. She wrote about 150 hymns, mostly for children, including some that she translated from the Latin.

“Lord, who throughout these forty days” is based on the account of the temptation of Jesus, found in Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, and Luke 4:1-13. In this hymn Christ’s life is a model for his followers, and how we should respond to temptation. The first two lines of each stanza tell of Jesus’ temptations, and the last two lines encourage us to model our behavior on Christ’s example.

The themes of Lent are in each stanza: fasting and prayer; struggle with Satan and sin; dying to self, and meditation on scripture; penance; and looking toward the joy of Easter.

This hymn is different from most of our Lenten hymns in that it doesn’t focus solely on the penance of Lent, but also leads us to the glory of Easter. I hope this hymn will be a part of your personal time of prayer and worship during these forty days.

Grace Church Contributes to The Well

Grace Church has been a consistent contributor in the effort to feed needy persons by making monthly food and monetary donations to The Well's distribution center south of our location on Main Street. Contributing food to The Well is quite easy for members of Grace Church. There is a bin located in the parish hall in which food items of any kind can be deposited. These food items are taken to The Well during the month and monthly totals are reported by the outreach liaison during monthly Mission Council meetings. The well also accepts online donations.

Grace Church has recently completed a record year of giving to The Well. In 2020 we contributed more than 1,000 lbs. of food in the effort to feed needy people in our area. These 1,000 lbs. of food were in addition to monetary donations made during the year. Thanks to everyone who donated in 2020. Your support is appreciated by the staff at The Well. Each month when our contributions are delivered, we are warmly greeted by the folks at The Well. We are always asked to thank everyone at Grace for our support.

As food needs are constant, The Well is continually involved in fund raising. This Spring they have scheduled a special event. It is a concert featuring "Casting Crowns", a popular contemporary Christian group. The concert is scheduled for Friday, April 2 at historic Rippavilla Plantation. Grace Church's revenue for January fell a bit short of expenses, but not greatly. Expenses were normal for January. The cost of natural gas was higher because of the extreme cold earlier this year.

Mission Council

Grace Episcopal Church Mission Council met February 18, 2021 at 6:30 via Zoom. The Mission Council officers and members are working to update the present bylaws of 2011. The purpose of these amendments is enabling to the Mission Council to establish a quorum and approve motions in an online video conferencing meeting, to dispense with the requirement to hold a second annual meeting in June, and to allow members of the Mission Council to serve as senior or junior warden for up to three years in a row, one year at a time.

New members of the Mission Council are Laurie McNutt, who will serve as liaison for Congregational Life, and Will Pomeroy, who is our Communications liaison. David Thomas is now the Treasurer with Ed Strong as assistant treasurer. Susan Austin, Jr. Warden, reported physical improvements that have been made to church property with her oversight. Lighting issues inside and outside Grace Church, which relate to both aesthetics and safety, are being addressed.

As Clerk of the Mission Council, I keep the official record of the meetings of the Mission Council. I am most grateful for all members who have kept me on top of things. ---Peggy Roberts, Clerk

Special Note from Father Joe

Friday afternoon, I learned that Dad's wife Joan has Covid 19. Saturday afternoon, I took him to be tested at a walk-in clinic. I tested negative, but he was positive. Two of Dad and Joan's caregivers are also positive, and the one that is not is staying away to be safe. I am in a 10 day quarantine with Dad at his house.

I got an appointment for Tuesday, March 9 to get Dad what's called a "bam infusion" of antibodies that should help him recover well and quickly. As I write this, that means we go tomorrow to the TriStar Medical Center in 100 Oaks for an intravenous treatment that takes about two and a half hours. So far, I have woken up each day feeling good. I am learning a lot about care giving for a loved one, and I am learning how impatient I am. I find myself extremely grateful for the people who help other people: the people who check your dad's car battery when it won't start because it hasn't been driven, the people who take your phone call when you are trying to make an appointment, the people who take care of the old and the handicapped. Their kindness is thinly veiled divine grace.

I have gotten several emails, texts, calls, and messages from people at Grace. Your prayers and words of encouragement make me feel a lot better. Thanks for your kindness and for your ears that listen and your eyes that read. This situation can be very isolating, as I now see for myself. You strengthen the bond we share in Christ which means we are never alone. I am most grateful.
