Terminology for Episcopalians

- Nave: the part of the church building where the people sit. The word "nave" shares a root with "navy." The ceiling of most churches resembles the bottom of a ship. For Christians, the Church is the ark of salvation.
- Sanctuary: the part of the church behind the altar rail, where the altar, the credence table (or shelf), and the aumbry or tabernacle are.
- Stewardship: responsibility for what has been entrusted to us. A steward cares for what belongs to someone else.
- Tithe: a tenth of someone's possessions.
- Pledge: a commitment or promise. Our pledge to the Church is what we have committed to give back to God by supporting his Church.
