Diocesan Day of Prayer

The year's Diocesan Day of Prayer is on Saturday, October 29. In the past, we have had volunteers commit to praying for thirty minute shifts through the day. We recommended topics of prayer such as the needs of our community, combatting Covid 19, or praying for the healing of political division and the improvement of relations between people of different races. We posted a sign-up sheet and broke the day into 30 minute segments. We will again sign up for times through the day for prayer, as in a prayer vigil. This time, I would like to add an aspect of group involvement for everyone concerned.

Each of us may submit two or three top prayer concerns to be combined into a document we may all share and refer to in our prayer time that day. This will be a way of asking the whole congregation to pray that day for matters that are important to each of us right now, such as a relative with cancer, or a child having difficulties in school or work, or the coming elections, or relief and freedom for the people of Ukraine and peace for the people of Russia, or the

children and teachers at Grace Church, or comfort for yourself or someone else who is grieving.

Please send the concerns you want us to pray for to me by email, letter, or personal note so that they reach me no later than Wednesday, October 26. I can put them together in an email and send it out to the congregation on Thursday, October 27. I could also leave paper copies of the list at church for people to pick them up on Wednesday afternoon, especially if they don't use email.

Please give this idea some thought and sign up to pray for a time segment with your fellow church members. The Day of Prayer will be divided into 30 minute segments between 7:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. If signing up doesn't work for you, just pick your own time, but let us know you are taking part by putting your name on the list or sending me word.

In addition to what we are doing for the Day of Prayer, please note that we are all invited to attend a service of Morning Prayer broadcast on the diocesan Facebook page at 9:00 a.m.

This is an event in which it does not matter how old or young you are. All can do their part. The experience of praying for the concerns of others while knowing they are praying for your concerns could be quite powerful. Thirty minutes may seem like a long time, but once you are in a quiet place and begin to pray, the time may fly by.

Neighborhood Food Insecurities

Have you been thinking that we all need to dig deeper into our pantry for The Well? Now there is a fantastic opportunity. Local food needs at The Well have increased 80% in August and 90% in September compared to 2021. As you may know, The Well serves anyone in need of food, but primarily residents of Maury and Williamson counties. For The Well this demand creates a 90% greater need for food but also results in a need for more volunteers to distribute this food to our neighbors. The holiday season also will only exacerbate additional need for food and support.

Grace Episcopal Church's latest contributions have included 208 pounds of staples plus \$100. On a much larger scale, The John Maher Whole Hog Festival was attended by approximately 6,000 people and raised about \$47,000 for The Well. Thank you to everyone who participated in this effort.

Is there any possibility that we can increase our efforts to meet the 90% increase in demand? Can we volunteer our time to support The Well and our neighbors with this challenge? Prayers are of immense benefit. Thanks in advance for your contributions.

Community Outreach

In Partnership with the Maury County Historical Society

Grace Episcopal Church has always enjoyed a mutually friendly and supportive relationship with the Maury County Historical Society. As many of

you may recall, in 2020, our beloved steeple bell had gone silent for several months. The Maury County Historical Society had sent out an invitation to apply for a grant to repair/improve identified historical properties in the county. Grace Episcopal Church was fortunate enough to be awarded one of those grants to fix our bell.

In return, Grace Church has always answered to the call to be one of the host sites for the Maury County Historical Society's annual tours and other events. This brings attention to the work of both the Historical Society and to our church - a solution where everyone benefits.

This spring we received another invitation to apply for a grant from the Historical Society. During one of our Mission Council meetings, it was discussed that the interior public areas of our Church could use a refresh. We applied for a grant to cover the cost of the paint, brushes, drop cloths and other materials necessary to repaint Faith Hall, the office, pantry, kitchen, hallways, and restrooms. Congregation volunteers would complete the actual painting.

On September 12, I received a letter from the Maury County Historical Society that Grace Church would be awarded a grant of \$600 to be used for the identified refresh. On Monday, September 26, your Senior Warden, Diann Schneider, and I traveled to Columbia where we were presented with the actual check.

We certainly appreciate the ongoing partnership between the Maury County Historical Society and Grace Church.

Grace Finances for September 2022

September was a good month for Grace's finances. Revenues were slightly increased over those in August, and expenses were decreased by a third of those for August. September gave us revenues of \$9,935.00 and \$7,881.40 in expenses, leaving a positive balance of \$2,053.60.

Year to date, Grace is still holding up well. Even though there've been spikes to revenues or expenses, revenues are trailing expenses by only \$2,261.76. We notice the revenue side heading into the holidays and have not had to move any funds from savings. Following is the general breakdown of funds, and the detailed information on accounts is attached.
