Four years after our last Lenten series, we will meet again on the Wednesday nights this Lent for prayer, dinner, and a time for thoughtful reflection. I will lead meditations on a special part of Antoine de Saint-Exupéry's 1943 classic, *The Little Prince*. The title of the series is *How to Tame the Fox*. The book tells how the Little Prince travels to different planets searching for friends and understanding until he is approached by a fox that asks him to tame him. The fox then teaches the Little Prince how. The fox imparts wisdom that can aid us in our life of prayer as we seek a closer relationship with God and as he seeks a closer relationship with us.

We will consider on the different nights 1) Why Tame the Fox? 2) No Time for Taming, 3) Taming the Fox in Seven No-So-Easy Steps, 4) Thursdays Are for Dancing: The Meaning of Time and the Need for Order, and 5) Seeing Rightly with the Heart: The Fruit of the Spiritual Life. Participants may sign up in the parish hall to attend, but anyone may come without signing up.

Starting this Wednesday, March 1, we will begin with Evening Prayer at 6:00 p.m. in the church, followed by dinner and the meditation. The purpose of these meditations is to help us recover the childlike attitude that Jesus said we need before we can enter the kingdom of God (Matthew 18:3).
