<u>Vicar's Vagaries</u> <u>Episcopal, Episcopalian</u>

Someone recently brought me a question from her granddaughter. "So what does Episcopal mean?" This is a question any Episcopalian ought to be able to answer. I hope the following explanation helps.

Episcopal is a biblical word. It comes from the Greek, episkopos, meaning overseer. Add epi (over) and skopos (seer) together, and you get episkopos. Just think of a related word, a submarine's periscope. It pops up out of the ocean depths and turns around to give the people below in the submarine a view of what's going on above the water level. As a periscope looks around, an episkopos oversees, leads, or takes care of. The word episkopos came to mean a bishop in the early church. The word bishop is derived from episkopos.

To this day, in the Episcopal Church, bishops are the chief pastors of their dioceses.

The Episcopal Church got its name from the fact that it is governed chiefly by bishops. The ministers of the church are listed in our catechism as the laity, deacons, priests, and bishops. The Nicene Creed says that the Church is "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic." Episcopal bishops are in an unbroken line of succession that goes from the first Apostles to the bishops of today. We call that connection the apostolic succession. It is one of the marks of the Church as Christ founded it that it be led by Apostles and their successors and that the church be apostolic in its faith and mission.

Let's clarify one grammatical matter while we are thinking about *Episcopal*. *Episcopal* is always an adjective, as in Episcopal Church or Episcopal priest. It describes a noun. What do you call a member of the Episcopal Church? An *Episcopalian*. *Episcopalian* is always a noun. It is the word for a member of the Episcopal Church.

It is a privilege to be part of a church with the rich historical traditions we share as Episcopalians in the Episcopal Church, which is part of the Anglican Communion, which is part of the "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church" founded by Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Father Joe

The Story of the Grace Organ

The organ which is played each Sunday is a jewel here in Middle Tennessee. It was installed in 1891, built by the Henry Pilcher and Sons Organ Company of Louisville, Kentucky. Henry Pilcher, Sr. was from Canterbury, England, and apprenticed as an organ builder in London. In 1832 he emigrated to New York and opened a business in Newark, New Jersey. His sons opened a firm in 1852 in St. Louis, MO, relocated to Chicago, and then moved to Louisville, KY in 1874. The company closed in 1944, after building over 1,800 instruments for churches, concert halls, and universities.

When the organ was first installed, there was no electricity in the church, and the organ was pumped by hand. Neighborhood children were hired to

pump the organ and were paid a nickel to do so! There is a knob on the console that is labeled "Signal." While the child was sitting back in the chamber amongst the pipes. When the organist would pull the knob, the child would know that he needed to start pumping the bellows so that the organist could play. No one is certain what the "signal" did: maybe there was a flag, or a sign that said "pump!" (I like to think that maybe a little boxing glove punched the kid!) Many of the children signed their names on the casework back in the chamber. I love reading them! I'm not certain when electricity was installed at Grace, but the latest date on the signatures is 1926.

If anyone has any questions about our lovely and historic organ, please feel free to ask! I will do my best to tell you whatever it is you would like to know.
